



Blackhawk Ski Club 2004 Annual Report April 4, 2005

Background:

The mission of Blackhawk Ski Club is to promote youth participation and competition in skiing and other outdoor sports. The goals are to:

- Develop and promote youth educational and training programs for lifelong outdoor sporting participation;
- Provide and improve facilities for skiing, biking and other outdoor recreation participation;
- Provide sponsorship and support for skiing and mountain biking training and competition;
- Provide equal opportunities for interested youth participants, regardless of income or ability; and
- Preserve the rustic, park-like characteristics of the property.

Summary of 2004 Program Accomplishments:

The major accomplishments during 2004 include the following:

- Covered the downhill and cross county trails with snow and operated almost 70 days during the winter of 2004-2005
- Provided instruction to over 130 kids who participated on Saturday mornings in 1st-2nd flight programs
- Delivered an enhanced the 3rd flight program to over 30 kids
- Held the annual ski Jumping meet with over 75 jumpers, including 23 from the Club
- Provided youth cross country ski instruction and cross county, biathlon, and Nordic combined races
- Sponsored a successful alpine racing program
- Involved 45 members in Telemark skiing programs on Wednesday nights
- Ran weekly mountain bike time trial series from mid-May to mid-September and hosted the Badger State Games mountain bike race

Summary of 2004 Facility Improvements:

- Improved the ski jumps for summer jumping with plastic mats and steel tracks
- Improved rope tow facilities on hill #5 by replacing all the tow poles
- Improved the terrain on hills #2 and #5
- Added lights to the cross country trails on the East side
- Purchased 2 used snowmaking fans; Piston Bully groomer; and new Kubota Tractor
- Improved sustainability of existing mountain bike trails
- Insulated and added heat to the large groomer shed

Membership Summary:

During 2004, we exceeded our membership goals, with a waiting list for family alpine members (over 225 family alpine memberships).

Summary: With the significant gifts, income was higher than normal. However, expenses were also. In the end, income exceeded expenses by about \$15,000.

Goals for 2005:

Next year, we hope to build on the success of the past year, and:

- Recruit more instructors and offer the 1st and 2nd Flight Programs
- Develop programs during other hours during the week, or weekend
- Organize a Nordic Combined program (jumping and cross country)
- Continue to develop our outreach program to include children with special needs
- Find volunteers to help with the club's newsletter
- Continue to enhance alpine terrain, such as the successful jump on Hill #2
- Raise \$50,000 to match the gift from the Taylor family foundation
- Review all existing mountain bike trails for sustainability and close down those that are subject to increased erosion while improving others
- Review Master Plan and decide trees to be removed and trees to be planted along trails and slopes
- Remove and burn existing deadfall and trim tress and remove from all roadways
- Install signs for bike trails and update trail map and post a laminated version at trail head (Chalets)

A.1. First- and Second-Flight Program

Purpose: Introduce children to alpine skiing

Chairs: Dave Norby

2004 Accomplishments:

- 130 kids participated in the 1st-2nd Flight Program, which ran from mid-December to the end of February
- Approximately 50 FF kids jumped the 15m during the season. Many of them participated in the tournament on February 12th
- Participation medals were awarded to all the kids and it was once again a huge hit
- Some parents organized a small pot-luck for the last day
- Ken Matussek provided a Ski Patrol demonstration for the kids
- Kris Kruse-Elliott has set up March 12 & 13 for the Level I Certification at Tyrol Eight qualified instructors have signed up for the program

2005 Goals:

- Consider developing FF type lessons for snowboarding
- Expand the lesson schedule to other available times such as later Saturday and Sunday afternoons. There continues to be a high demand for lessons.

A.2. Third-Flight Program

Purpose: Provide advanced instruction to children as they learn how to ski.

2004 Accomplishments:

- Over 30 kids participated in 2004-2005, three times as many as last year.
- They had two coaches and sessions were Saturday morning and Monday evening.
- The awards and party were held February 28th

2005 Goals:

- A new 4th Flight program to be a beginning race program. Kids would compete in Wisconsin Alpine Junior Racing Association (WAJRA) events.

A.3. Jumping Program

Purpose: Coordinate all aspects of the ski jumping program

2004 Accomplishments:

- Will Schott attended the Junior National Championships in Steamboat.
- The tournament on Feb. 12 attracted 75 jumpers from around the Midwest including 23 Blackhawk jumpers.
- The steel track was used for the winter tournament 60m jump due to extreme melting. It was a great success in the winter weather
- Recruitment efforts worked beyond our 2004 goals, with 30 new jumpers using the 15M jump this year
- Built a bump jump on Hill #2, which was used prior to the 15M jump
- Training and clinics:
 - 2 division wide 2 day clinics held in May and Aug attended by 30+ jumpers from other clubs economically self sustaining
 - 1 National one day training session late Oct. attended by 15 + jumpers
 - 2 division wide tournaments held in Feb and Oct
 - Feb Junior Olympic Qualifier for Nordic combined event
 - Club training May-June Aug-Nov Jan-March T/R evenings 6-8:30
- Skiers accomplishments:
- Black Hawk was represented at every junior tournament held this winter in the Central division
- 13 Black Hawk jumpers attended Badger State Games
- 2 members of Black Hawk are on the Central Divisions Development Team and participated in Park City in Aug at Springertournee
- 3 members of Black Hawk participated in Central Senior events at Norge target jump, Silvermines comp. 2 members in Mpls target jump
- 1 member of Black Hawk participated in Lake Placids New Years comp and was a member of Central USSA Junior Olympic team
- Facilities:
 - 60M reprofile landing hill, plastic to landing hill, inrun carpet on either side of steel track
 - 30M plastic on either side of steel track
 - 15M plastic on landing and inrun retied if loose

2005 Goals:

- Provide additional coaching for the 15M jump 6-7:30pm T/R and Sat AMs
- Add a watering system for the 60M tower and landing
- Finish 60M landing, finish plastic (ordered already), reshape bump, and contour and sod sides of hill
- Power for snow making to the bottom of the 60M and mid-landing and the bottom of the 30M
- Add lights to the 60M tower and outrun and 30M tower and out run
- Run 3 2-day training clinics May/ Aug/ Oct
- Sponsor 2 tournaments Jan/ Oct (Jan JO Qualifier for NC)
- Widen 60M platform on top of tower add 20 ft to tower

A.4. Alpine Racing

Purpose: Coordinate all aspects of the alpine racing program.

Chair: Todd Tiefenthaler, Co-Chair: Steve Cohan

2004 Accomplishments:

- Blackhawk Alpine Ski Racing program was primarily open to members of the Madison Alpine Racing Team (MART), a high-level junior racing program.
- Nine racers participated in the 2004-2005 race season
- Racers were very successful, competing in the USSA/FIS Rocky/Central Regional Championships in Aspen, the Southern Conference (high school) boys championships, the state High School Championships, Junior Nationals in Sugar Bush, Maine, Eastern HS Nationals in Gunstock, New Hampshire, and races in Steamboat Springs and Winter Park
- The snow on hill #5 provided outstanding race conditions all year long
- The racers upgraded the tow on hill #5 with new poles

2005 Goals:

- 3rd flight skiers who wish to explore alpine racing shall have the opportunity to participate in a "4th flight" program and potentially work towards active involvement in the MART program
- Develop a "4th flight program" that will train on hills 5 and 6 and will participate in WIJARA, regional weekend Alpine series races as well as High School races
- Develop a feeder program focusing on increasing the competency of Junior alpine skiers, eventually participating in the MART
- Begin on-snow training in late November 2005
- Erect a starting ramp on the top of Hill 5, repair and/or replace lights on hills 5 and 6, add semi-permanent safety fence on the left side of hill 5 and hill 6, etc.

A.5. **Nordic Skiing**

Purpose: To promote and introduce Nordic ski activities to novice through elite level skiers of all ages.

2004 Accomplishments:

- Provided instruction to youth in cross country and biathlon
- Held Nordic combined race during the jumping competition
- Worked with MadNorski to hold the Ice Age Challenge
- Held the Second Annual Blackhawk sprints

2005 Goals:

- The trail improvements will include lighting for night skiing and widening for snowmaking and races. Trails to be modified will take into account other club activities such as mountain biking, jumping and alpine long term plans. Some trails will be left as single-track classic to retain the backwoods experience.
- Improved and Expanded Snow Making: This will include adding permanent pipe and electrical outlets near the existing trails at the base of the alpine runs and jumps. New water pipe and a 480-volt outlet for snowmaking will be extended to south of the east chalet for the 1-kilometer loop located in the pine trees south of the east chalet.
- Additional lights will be added to the pines trail to fill in dark spots and at the end of the 30-meter outrun and the connecting trail between the 60 meter outrun and hill #5.
- Add trail signs and names to club trails. Trail names to reflect the history of the club
- Purchase and maintain 20 to 25 sets of Nordic Ski equipment for instruction and introduction of Nordic skiing to club youth
- Construct equipment storage / work/ clothes changing building to be located near the east chalet
- Plant and transplant trees along Nordic trails to provide shade and prevent overcrowding of existing trees
- Layout a combination start and finish area (Stadium) for races that can be used for soccer in the summer

A.5. **Telemark Skiing**

Purpose: Coordinate adult and youth Telemark skiing program, introduce skiers to telemark skiing technique, and provide a venue to preserve the traditional telemark turn and technique.

2004 Accomplishments:

- Program had 45 participants this year, a 9 % increase over last year
- Provided telemark program opportunities for beginner to experienced skiers. Cross section of experience level includes (no telemark experience (27%), < 1 yr experience (20%), 1 – 5 yrs experience (20%) and > 5yrs experience (33 %)
- Provided an opportunity for experienced telemark skiers to share their expertise with new and other experienced skiers.
- Served a role as one of the only telemark programs in the Midwest
- Served a role to support a community of skiers interested in preserving one of the original forms of skiing
- Provided informal instruction to beginning telemark skiers and advanced technique for experienced skiers
- Set up slalom courses to help skiers improve turning techniques
- Held an annual “Retro” telemark night to help preserve the history and evolution of the equipment and technique

2005 Goals:

- Continue to promote the sport of telemark skiing. It may be an exhibition sport at the next Olympics and possibly make a comeback as a future Olympic Sport
- Involve more participants in the program next year
- Provide more instructional opportunities for beginning to advanced telemark skiers.

A.7. Mountain Biking

Purpose: Coordinate activities related to mountain biking including time trials, mountain bike racing and instructional programs. Oversee trail development and maintenance.

2004 Accomplishments:

- Held the time trial series on Wednesday evenings
- Hosted the mountain biking event for Badger State Games
- Held a FORCS training camp
- Several podium finishes from members at State, National and International events
- Improved trails at club and other local areas including Camrocks and Blue Mounds

2005 Goals:

- Time trial series-promote the sustainability of this event and its ongoing success
- Continue to recruit youth into the sport (through time trials and special events)
- Institute training program for juniors
- Continue to act as training grounds for competitive cyclists within the club
- Badger State Games-increase rider participation, increase Blackhawk support and involvement

- FORCS training camp-July
- Critically evaluate trail network at Blackhawk and eliminate some and make remaining ones sustainable
- Investigate increased trail access for specific events such as Badger State Games-(Erdman and Rounds property)
- Post trail signs and name trails
- Update trail map and post a laminated version at trail head (Chalets)
- Support acquisition of tools for trail maintenance
- Support a mountain bike only membership

B. FACILITIES AND OPERATIONS COMMITTEE

B.1. Groundskeeping

Purpose: Oversee mowing, trail maintenance, and tree trimming throughout the property. Maintain all roads and parking lots in summer and winter, including snowplowing.

Chair: Paul Manley

2004 Accomplishments

- Purchased new Kubota Tractor for mowing, trailwork, and general facilities maintenance
- Placed and moved fill on hills #2 and 5/6
- Removed dead cottonwoods from bottom of #2
- Cleared trees to widen XC trails in east pines
- General brush clearing to widen XC trails for easier snowmaking

2005 Goals: Big emphasis on trail improvement for both Alpine and XC trails to facilitate snowmaking and grooming

- Erosion control- Seed and straw last year fill to prevent erosion
- 3 drainage ditches need attention. Deal with runoff problem on east side of #4. and continuing runoff at the bottom of the road. Improve the channel on the east side of the road. Improve runoff on east side of #6
- Road improvements. If drainage issues get taken care of
- Clear wood from #1 slope(see alpine operations)
- XC trail leveling and expansion (see XC report)
- Clearing brush from #3/4 if time(see Alpine operations)

B.2. Alpine Operations/Grooming

Purpose: Ensure that the downhill skiing areas are suitable for winter operations by maintaining rope tows, towpaths, and safety gates and by grooming the slopes. Ensure that all x-country trails are maintained and groomed in the winter

Chair: Dan Osborne

2004 Accomplishments

- Purchased used Piston Bully 200 which improved our ability to move and groom snow on Alpine and XC trails
- Added very popular terrain features on #2

- Rebuilt the # 5 tow thanks to the Alpine racing team
- Newer grooming equipment along with new snow machines improved the snow quality and coverage
- Emphasis on upgrading our equipment brings greater reliability
- Use of contract labor takes some of the burden off of member/volunteers

2005 Goals:

- Continue to improve terrain with features like groomable jumps and more snowable/groomable terrain
- Clear trees and brush from Hill #1 to make snowmaking and grooming more efficient. This will also make #1 more user friendly for the novice (pre-flighter)
- Tow safety signage- Need to install signs on all tows according to ANSI Stds
- Re-align tow #2
- Lighting fixes on #5&6, 1&2 and top of #5 (Chalet) Replace old fixtures, add, replace bulbs
- Terrain features on #2 improve areas with small amount of fill. Addition of some fill in specific areas could require less snowmaking for terrain
- Terrain features on #3/4. This is a large project that may take a few years of work depending upon availability of help. Clear brush and re-grade terrain so area is skiable and easy to groom / make snow
- Race start platform on top of #5
- Earlier start/opening day for hill activities should be a goal every year. Should be achieved with greater operational efficiency in October and November.

B.3. Snowmaking

Purpose: Coordinate and direct snowmaking activities for both downhill and jumping by providing a schedule of workers and a contact list for snowmaking; ensuring adequate snowmaking equipment is provided in areas of operation (hoses, guns, propane torches, etc.); and ensure that trained personnel are onsite to operate the compressors and water pump. Ensure that all snowmaking equipment works properly and is adequately maintained (includes water pumps, hoses, air compressor, pipes, and snow guns)

Chair: Don Wylie

2004 Accomplishments:

This is the area of our club that has seen the most noticeable upgrades in the last year. The emphasis for the year was more automation with newer equipment. Thanks to a generous financial donation and a lot of work from a few individuals we were able to complete our first phase of the improvement to our snowsystem.

- Purchased 2 Areco Supersnow fanguns
- Upgraded power on east and west side to 480v 3 phase power to run new snowguns
- Used more contract labor for snowmaking efforts to try to ease the burden on volunteers

- Learned from first year with new system. Can use this knowledge to make both small adjustments to system as well as plan for larger system improvements in the future
- 100% Coverage of Alpine Slopes and jumps plus a large % of XC trails were covered with man-made snow

2005 Goals:

The improvements to the snowmaking system will largely depend upon the clubs ability to fundraise for improvements along with the willingness of our membership to coordinate and share the responsibilities of completing the work in time for snowmaking next fall. This is more likely a 2-4 year plan that will have to be completed in annual segments. It is the responsibility of the snowmaking committee to set priorities and a plan for proceeding with improvements.

- Extend 480 power across base of hill to allow easier snowmaking on Jumps and XC areas
- Purchase more fan guns
- Assess the future need for our compressors (How many) if the direction is towards more Fan type guns. This dictates the need for power upgrades at the compressor building and pump house
- Look at ways to move/place snow with tractor, trailers, spreaders etc.
- Power upgrade on West side
- Permanent pipe extensions to reach new areas
- Explore ways to solve freeze ups in line. Closed loop, more drain valves.etc.
- New water pump to increase capacity and PSI. Study how many guns we want to run and at what PSI. Pump and pipe system should be able to achieve these values
- Improve heating and ventilation in both the compressor building and the pump house. Pump house may need expansion if new pump is installed
- Explore more automation that is user friendly. We have relatively untrained volunteer workers so automation has to remain uncomplicated

B.4. Building/electrical maintenance

Purpose: Maintain chalets and outbuildings, oversee all electrical facilities.

2004 Accomplishments:

- Complete lighting on hill #6. Replace lighting on hill #5
- Map the entire electrical systems and label all panels and equipment
- Fixed leaking roof on piston bully shed.
- Insulated and installed heat to piston bully shed

2005 Goals:

- Repair/replace lights on hill #2
- Repair soffits on west chalet/ repair roof on tow shed

- Replace roof on old bully shed
- Build dog house around big valves
- Pump outhouse
- Install exit signs on both chalets
- Install scissor door on new bully shed
- Complete 440 wiring for new snow guns

B.5. Ski Patrol

Purpose: Ensure that ski patrollers are present during all hours of alpine operation and that they are aware of club policies (e.g., jumps, snowboard terrain, etc.). Responsible for opening and closing the ski area. Coordinates need for snow making/grooming with other committees.
