**Summary of 2005 Program Accomplishments:**

The major accomplishments during 2005 include the following:

- Covered the downhill and cross country trails with snow and operated almost \_\_ days during the winter of 2005-2006
- Provided instruction to over \_\_130 kids who participated on Saturday mornings in 1<sup>st</sup>-2<sup>nd</sup> flight programs (compared with 130 kids last year).

## A. PROGRAM COMMITTEES

### First- and Second-Flight Program

Purpose: Introduce children to alpine skiing

Chairs: Dave Norby

Members: Lindsay Baptiste and Kelley Linnan

#### 2005 Accomplishments:

- Approximately 275 kids participated in the 1<sup>st</sup>-2<sup>nd</sup> Flight Program, which ran from early December to late February
- Expanded program to run, not only Saturday morning, but also Saturday afternoon, Sunday, Monday and Thursday
- Participation medals were awarded to all the kids and it was once again a huge hit
- Some parents organized a small pot-luck for the last day of each lesson time
- Ken Matussek provided a Ski Patrol demonstration for the kids
- Introduced 100+ children in 1<sup>st</sup>-2<sup>nd</sup> Flight to hill #5 and #6

#### 2006 Goals:

- Develop FF type lessons for snowboarding
- Increase instructor numbers to allow for additional children in 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, and 3<sup>rd</sup> Flight programs
- Better integrate 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, and 3<sup>rd</sup> Flight program to allow for more children to graduate on to higher ability levels
- Introduce all able children to hills 5 and 6
- Incorporate bibs into First Flight program

#### Long-term Goals:

- Develop 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, and 3<sup>rd</sup> Flight type lessons for snowboarding with competitive programs
- Combine 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, and 3<sup>rd</sup> Flight programs to be one program as opposed to two separate groups
- Allow easier access for children to ski between east and west sides of Blackhawk
- Blackhawk should be one ski hill not two separate hills.

Additional Budget Items:

- 150 bibs to be used by all 1<sup>st</sup>-2<sup>nd</sup> Flight students.
- Drill and bit for use on west side
- Additional brush gates
- Ski poles for children to use while in lessons

**A.2. Third-Flight Program**

2004 Accomplishments:

- Over 30 kids participated in 2004-2005, three times as many as last year.
- They had two coaches and sessions were Saturday morning and Monday evening.

2005 Goals:

- A new 4<sup>th</sup> Flight program to be a beginning race program. Kids would compete in Wisconsin Alpine Junior Racing Association (WAJRA) events.

**A.3. Jumping Program**

Purpose: Coordinate all aspects of the ski jumping program

2004 Accomplishments:

- Will Schott attended the Junior National Championships in Steamboat.
- The tournament on Feb. 12 attracted 75 jumpers from around the Midwest including 23 Blackhawk jumpers.
- The steel track was used for the winter tournament 60m jump due to extreme melting. It was a great success in the winter weather
- Recruitment efforts worked beyond our 2004 goals, with 30 new jumpers using the 15M jump this year
- Built a bump jump on Hill #2, which was used prior to the 15M jump
- Training and clinics:
  - 2 division wide 2 day clinics held in May and Aug attended by 30+ jumpers from other clubs economically self sustaining
  - 1 National one day training session late Oct. attended by 15 + jumpers
  - 2 division wide tournaments held in Feb and Oct

- Feb Junior Olympic Qualifier for Nordic combined event
- Club training May-June Aug-Nov Jan-March T/R evenings 6-8:30
- Skiers accomplishments:
- Black Hawk was represented at every junior tournament held this winter in the Central division
- 13 Black Hawk jumpers attended Badger State Games
- 2 members of Black Hawk are on the Central Divisions Development Team and participated in Park City in Aug at Springertournee
- 3 members of Black Hawk participated in Central Senior events at Norge target jump, Silvermines comp. 2 members in Mpls target jump
- 1 member of Black Hawk participated in Lake Placids New Years comp and was a member of Central USSA Junior Olympic team
- Facilities:
  - 60M reprofile landing hill, plastic to landing hill, inrun carpet on either side of steel track
  - 30M plastic on either side of steel track
  - 15M plastic on landing and inrun retied if loose

#### 2005 Goals:

- Provide additional coaching for the 15M jump 6-7:30pm T/R and Sat AMs
- Add a watering system for the 60M tower and landing
- Finish 60M landing, finish plastic (ordered already), reshape bump, and contour and sod sides of hill
- Power for snow making to the bottom of the 60M and mid-landing and the bottom of the 30M
- Add lights to the 60M tower and outrun and 30M tower and out run
- Run 3 2-day training clinics May/ Aug/ Oct
- Sponsor 2 tournaments Jan/ Oct (Jan JO Qualifier for NC)
- Widen 60M platform on top of tower add 20 ft to tower

#### A.4. Alpine Racing

Purpose: Coordinate all aspects of the alpine racing program.

Chair: Todd Tiefenthaler, Co-Chair: Steve Cohan

#### 2004 Accomplishments:

- Blackhawk Alpine Ski Racing program was primarily open to members of the Madison Alpine Racing Team (MART), a high-level junior racing program.
- Nine racers participated in the 2004-2005 race season
- Racers were very successful, competing in the USSA/FIS Rocky/Central Regional Championships in Aspen, the Southern Conference (high school) boys championships, the state High School Championships, Junior Nationals in Sugar

Bush, Maine, Eastern HS Nationals in Gunstock, New Hampshire, and races in Steamboat Springs and Winter Park

- The snow on hill #5 provided outstanding race conditions all year long
- The racers upgraded the tow on hill #5 with new poles

#### 2005 Goals:

- 3rd flight skiers who wish to explore alpine racing shall have the opportunity to participate in a "4th flight" program and potentially work towards active involvement in the MART program
- Develop a "4th flight program" that will train on hills 5 and 6 and will participate in WIJARA, regional weekend Alpine series races as well as High School races
- Develop a feeder program focusing on increasing the competency of Junior alpine skiers, eventually participating in the MART
- Begin on-snow training in late November 2005
- Erect a starting ramp on the top of Hill 5, repair and/or replace lights on hills 5 and 6, add semi-permanent safety fence on the left side of hill 5 and hill 6, etc.

#### A.5. Nordic Skiing

Purpose: To promote and introduce Nordic ski activities to novice through elite level skiers of all ages. To provide a facility that will promote the development of Nordic skiers throughout the year

Chair: Mark Torresani

#### 2005 / 2006 Accomplishments:

- Provided instruction to over 50 youth in Nordic programs
- Worked with MadNorski to combine efforts in introductory and racing Youth Nordic Programs
- Held the Nordic Fun Day including a biathlon children's races and the 5K Ice Age Challenge
- Contracted with a coach for Nordic Programs
- Continued to improve trails by widening, leveling and adding lights
- Managed and coordinated the access road improvements, including the engineering for and the installation of 3 culverts and perimeter drainage channels
- Purchased and maintained 40 sets of youth Nordic Ski equipment for use by club members
- Purchased and modified a 10' x 10' shed for storing Nordic Ski equipment and for use as a race timers building.
- Had three club skiers compete at National and Junior Olympic Nordic ski events
- Maintained snow on the only skiable Nordic trail in Southern Wisconsin through the January 2006 snow drought and warm weather

#### 2006-2007 Season Goals:

- The trail improvements will include lighting for night skiing and widening for snowmaking and races.
  - Plan for and establish expanded trails off the current Blackhawk Property with specific efforts to extend the current trail system to the east to the Pleasant View Golf Course trail system.
  - Add trail signs and names to club trails. Trail names to reflect the history of the club and locations (i.e. Stan's Loop, Siberian Highway, Creek Side etc.)
  - The trail on top of Run #4 will be widened to allow for a race course that will bring skiers up #4 and down run #1 past the west Chalet
  - Determine if there is an alternative trail route that can avoid the road crossing
  - Continue to Develop a "stadium start/finish area north of the 10 meter biathlon range suitable for starting and finishing races.
  - Purchase and modify a manure spreader for spreading snow on the Nordic trails where snow making is not practical.
  - Investigate if a wider groomer for the trails is feasible and economical
  - Purchase one 50 meter biathlon target for use at other facilities to prepare Blackhawk biathletes for competition.
  - Obtain the permits and approvals to develop a 50 Meter 10 point Biathlon Range. This will include a study of selecting a potential location and determining technical, safety and financial aspects of building a range at Blackhawk. The initial concerns to be addressed are zoning constraints wetlands, shooting safety and the concerns of neighboring property owners. Permits may be needed for local zoning codes and wetland issues.
  - Obtain a separate coach / instructor for each Nordic Program (Intro, Biathlon, Silverski, Juniors) that will coordinate activities and events through the Nordic Programs Director and overall Youth Program Director for all Blackhawk youth programs.
  - Hold the Annual Nordic Fun Day Event / Races in February (open to public) fund raiser (held one week prior to the American Birkiebeiner) This event will be held in conjunction with MadNorSki Nordic Ski Club as a fund raiser for youth Nordic Programs
  - Work with the , US Biathlon Association, WDNR and other area ski clubs to hold a Biathlon Clinic in September at the Southern Unit Kettle Moraine Biathlon Range.
  - Support Olympic Qualifying Races and Racers,

#### **A.5. Telemark Skiing**

**Purpose:** Coordinate adult and youth Telemark skiing program, introduce skiers to telemark skiing technique, and provide a venue to preserve the traditional telemark turn and technique.

**2004 Accomplishments:**

- Program had 45 participants this year, a 9 % increase over last year
- Provided telemark program opportunities for beginner to experienced skiers. Cross section of experience level includes (no telemark experience (27%), < 1 yr experience (20%), 1 – 5 yrs experience (20%) and > 5yrs experience (33 %)
- Provided an opportunity for experienced telemark skiers to share their expertise with new and other experienced skiers.
- Served a role as one of the only telemark programs in the Midwest
- Served a role to support a community of skiers interested in preserving one of the original forms of skiing
- Provided informal instruction to beginning telemark skiers and advanced technique for experienced skiers
- Set up slalom courses to help skiers improve turning techniques
- Held an annual “Retro” telemark night to help preserve the history and evolution of the equipment and technique

#### 2005 Goals:

- Continue to promote the sport of telemark skiing. It may be an exhibition sport at the next Olympics and possibly make a comeback as a future Olympic Sport
- Involve more participants in the program next year
- Provide more instructional opportunities for beginning to advanced telemark skiers.

#### A.7. Mountain Biking

Purpose: Coordinate activities related to mountain biking including time trials, mountain bike racing and instructional programs. Oversee trail development and maintenance.

#### 2004 Accomplishments:

- Held the time trial series on Wednesday evenings
- Hosted the mountain biking event for Badger State Games
- Held a FORCS training camp
- Several podium finishes from members at State, National and International events
- Improved trails at club and other local areas including Camrocks and Blue Mounds

#### 2005 Goals:

- Time trial series-promote the sustainability of this event and its ongoing success
- Continue to recruit youth into the sport (through time trials and special events)
- Institute training program for juniors
- Continue to act as training grounds for competitive cyclists within the club
- Badger State Games-increase rider participation, increase Blackhawk support and involvement
- FORCS training camp-July

### **B.1. Facilities and Grounds**

Purpose: Oversee mowing, trail maintenance, and tree trimming throughout the property. Maintain all roads and parking lots in summer and winter, including snowplowing.

Chair: Dan Osborne

#### 2005 Accomplishments:

- Upgraded west side power for snowmaking and installed new breaker panel and outside light switches in west chalet.
- Installed 3 new fan gun outlets from compressor bldg along bottom of hill.
- New portable XC Nordic bldg
- Doghouse built over Gate Valves
- Extensive road and culvert work done along west ditch to improve drainage and road quality
- Overall large increase in use of the facility. More skiers, cars, machines in a relatively small area will be a continuing challenge to manage.

#### Goals for 2006:

- Set priorities for shingle/roof repair on 2 chalets and compressor building.
- Replace electrical receptacles in west chalet.
- Clean up compressor building
- Move wires underground from east chalet to 60M jump
- Stain inside of west chalet
- Erosion control on top of #5/6.
- Study issue of XC road crossing to improve traffic problems. Temporary and long term solution.
- Continue road work. Additional rock or tree removal?
- Clean up old machinery west of compressor building
- Tow path and tow repair and maintenance. All Tows

### **B.2. Alpine Operations/Grooming**

Purpose: Ensure that the downhill skiing areas are suitable for winter operations by maintaining rope tows, towpaths, and safety gates and by grooming the slopes. Ensure that all x-country trails are maintained and groomed in the winter

Chair: Dan Osborne

#### 2005 Accomplishments:

- Alpine, XC, and Jump facilities stayed operational, and well maintained despite record high January temps.
- New snowmaking guns and additional power outlets combined with new groomers improved snow quality.
- New tow safety signage on alpine tows
- Race start on hill #5 thanks to MART and Intercon Construction
- Trained new members as Piston Bully operators.
- Cleared trees on #1 making more skiable terrain and easier grooming and snowmaking.
- Hill #5 Snowed by first week of December
- XC trail used to move equipment across property during warm spells to keep snow quality high.
- New and improved jumps on #2 and #1.

#### 2006-2007 Goals:

- Finish hill #1 terrain
- Add and repair lighting on #1
- Re-wire and light #5 Towpath
- Train more new members to run equipment and facilities.
- Clear, smooth and seed towpaths
- New/used tracks for PB 100
- Terrain features on hill #2. Jumps, bumps, etc.

### **B.3. Snowmaking**

Purpose: Coordinate and direct snowmaking activities for downhill, jumping, and Nordic by providing a schedule of workers and a contact list for snowmaking; ensuring adequate snowmaking equipment is provided in areas of operation (hoses, guns, propane torches, etc.); and ensure that trained personnel are onsite to operate the compressors and water pump. Ensure that all snowmaking equipment works properly and is adequately maintained (includes water pumps, hoses, air compressor, pipes, and snow guns)

#### 2005 Accomplishments:

- Upgraded power on West side
- Ran about 300 hours and pumped 4.24 million gallons of water (water usage is similar to last year but the hours of operation are 30% more)

#### 2006 Goals:

- Purchase more snow guns

- Extend 480 power across base of hill to allow easier snowmaking on Jumps and Nordic trails and areas
- Look at ways to move/place snow with tractor, trailers, spreaders etc.
- Permanent pipe extensions to reach new areas
- Explore ways to solve freeze ups in line. Closed loop, more drain valves.etc.
- New water pump to increase capacity and PSI. Study how many guns we want to run and at what PSI. Pump and pipe system should be able to achieve these values
- Improve heating and ventilation in both the compressor building and the pump house. Pump house may need expansion if new pump is installed
- Explore more automation that is user friendly. We have relatively untrained volunteer workers so automation has to remain uncomplicated

#### **B.4. Ski Patrol**

Purpose: Ensure that ski patrollers are present during all hours of alpine operation and that they are aware of club policies (e.g., jumps, snowboard terrain, etc.). Responsible for opening and closing the ski area. Coordinates need for snow making/grooming with other committees.
