### Board Meeting Minutes: **Monday, October 9, 2006: 7-9 PM**

Members present: DuRose, Norby, Kelley, Osborne, Matusek, Hackworthy, Cohan, Houston, Manley, Torresani, Hoffmann, Peterson, Remington.

1. The minutes from the September meeting were approved
2. Osborne presented an update of the online membership registration. About 245 families have registered. Nearly all lessons are full. The system worked well, despite a few minor problems.
3. Hoffmann presented an update on the BASH. The ski tourney was very successful on both small and large jumps. The event grossed about \$10,000, with \$4,000 from corporate donations, \$4,000 from individuals, \$1,100 from fish bowls, \$400 from the raffle, and \$400 from apparel sales. Next year we need to develop a 6-person team to plan the event. Using the email list will help with marketing. Pat R. agreed to contact Tom Shipley about fund raising. Pat R. will also contact Sinberg thanking him for his contributions and requesting an invoice (to document the in-kind donation).
4. Remington and Hoffmann described request from Ambra Baldwin, REI to use the Club. More information is needed about number of people and date of event before the request can be approved.
5. Osborne presented plans for snow making in 2006-2007. Houston moved and Norby seconded a request for \$17,000 to a 3<sup>rd</sup> Aerco snow gun. The motion passed unanimously.
6. Cohan presented a proposal for an outreach program, to integrate our disadvantaged youth outreach program with the Shelly Glover foundation. Matusek moved and Osborne seconded that we approve the proposal. The motion passed unanimously.
7. Torresani described a request from the Capitol City Sprints to bring snow to Blackhawk after the event. More information is needed before a decision can be made. He also presented an update on the xc ski programs. May consider hiring a coach for the programs in the future.
8. An update on the jumping program was given. There were competitors from 4 states at the BASH meet. Twenty-two kids are in the summer jumping program. Ted Schulz will volunteer for the Sat AM program. The East Chalet roof was replaced and the new shed nearly completed by the jumpers.
8. Kelley provided an update on the BASS. Almost 200 kids are signed up. Thurs and Sat programs are full. New members will complete sign up on Oct 21<sup>st</sup>.
9. Norby described the award of the medallion to Ray Catell for his decades of service to the club.
10. The meeting was adjourned at 8:45 PM.
